2.2. PREPAREDNESS FOR SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT I:

The examination was scheduled from 16th to 27th September 2023. The steps taken for the success of the exam -

- **2.2.0. Examination orientation**: An examination orientation was held on 13th September 2024, where all the necessary information was shared. This included the examination schedule, timing to be followed, and the general examination protocols.
- **2.2.1. Examination routine**: The examination routine for all classes, from Nursery to Class VIII, was prepared following the standard pattern. It was distributed to the students on 2nd September 2024.
- **2.2.2.** *Examination sitting plan :* The examination sitting plan has been arranged to ensure a smooth flow during the exam, ensuring that no students from the same class are seated together.
- **2.2.3. Examination register**: A register containing details of the subjects, exam schedules, and student absentees was maintained to ensure accurate record-keeping and facilitate smooth monitoring during the examinations.
- **2.2.4. Examination admit card**: The admit cards were distributed to students on 2nd September 2024. This document contains all the important details of each student and serves as a mandatory requirement for entry into the examination hall. It is essential for all students to bring their admit cards to ensure smooth verification and compliance during the exam process.
- **2.2.5.** Examination attendance chart: The attendance chart is specifically created to record student presence during examinations. Unlike the regular attendance register, this chart focuses solely on exam attendance, ensuring an accurate record of participation for each assessment.
- **2.2.6. Examination duty chart**: The duty chart is maintained to ensure that teachers are assigned to different exam halls on a rotation basis. This systematic approach helps distribute responsibilities evenly among staff members and ensures adequate supervision during examinations.
- **2.2.7. Summative Assessment I**: The Summative Assessment I was conducted from 16th to 24th September 2024 for Nursery to UKG, and from 16th to 27th September 2024 for Classes I to VIII. The examination process went smoothly, with all students participating except for two students from Class VII: Cyclone and Ansuli. The successful conclusion of the exams reflects the effective preparation and organization put in place for this assessment period.

3. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

3.1. MASS BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION:

On 2nd September 2024, Oasis Academy celebrated the birthdays of all students and teachers born in September during the morning assembly. Each celebrant received a personalized card and a sweet chocolate treat

as a token of appreciation. The entire school community gathered to sing a heartfelt birthday song, fostering a joyful and inclusive atmosphere. This celebration helped strengthen the sense of belonging and unity among students and staff, making everyone feel valued on their special day.

3.2. TEACHER'S DAY CELEBRATION:

On **5th September 2024**, Oasis Academy celebrated its second **Teachers' Day** with great enthusiasm. Under the guidance of the Teachers' Day Committee, students decorated the Multi Utility Hall and prepared the venue. 3.3. MODEL UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE:

The Yasashi Model United Nations (MUN) Conference 2024 was hosted by the Down Town School, Hathisila, Guwahati, from **6th to 8th September 2024**. The conference aimed to bring young minds together to discuss global issues and foster leadership through four key committees: Journalism (ICIJ), UN Human Rights Council (UNHRC), UN Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW), and Lok Sabha.

16 students from Oasis Academy participated, accompanied by two teachers. Oasis Academy won the "Most Promising School Award" and Ms. Chintinkim Kipgen from Class VIII received a Special Mention in the ICIJ-P committee.

The event featured a grand opening ceremony with notable dignitaries like Chief Guest **Dr. Amarjyoti Choudhury**, followed by eight committee sessions. The event also included a social gathering on the second day and concluded on 8th September with a closing ceremony where awards were distributed.

The event successfully combined intellectual debates with social engagement, leaving a significant impact on the young participants



3.4. FELICITATION PROGRAM FOR MUN 2024:

A felicitation program was held at the Multiutility Hall to celebrate Oasis Academy's achievement at the Yasashi Model United Nations Conference 2024, where the school received the Most Promising School Award. Sixteen students, accompanied by two teachers, participated in the event, with Ms. Chintinkim Kipgen of Class VIII earning a Special Mention in the ICIJ-P committee.

The chief guest, Advocate Mr. Armstrong N Sangma, praised the students for their efforts and encouraged them to continue studying diligently and contributing positively to society. He also shared his personal struggles and experiences in accessing education, offering an inspiring testimony. 3.5. WORLD SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY:

On 10th September 2024, Oasis Academy observed **World Suicide Prevention Day** with an event titled **"Changing the Narrative on Suicide"**. The program, attended by students from classes VI to VIII and the staff, began with a welcome address and Introduction to the observation day by Principal **Md. Elizabeth**.

Mr. Sichulo P Apon, the school counselor, delivered a presentation addressing societal stigma and the importance of shifting the conversation around suicide to focus on empathy and support. The event concluded with a Q&A session, promoting mental health awareness and encouraging open dialogue.


















4. PROFESSIONAL CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS:

4.1. POLICY TRAINING:

On 3rd September 2024, Diana Jagtap, HR Manager - Learning and Development at Oasis India, conducted an online training session via Microsoft Teams. The session was aimed at new staff members of Oasis India and focused on essential organizational policies, including Employee Provident Fund (EPF) and Employee State Insurance Corporation (ESIC). Diana covered the key aspects of these policies, providing new employees with a comprehensive understanding of the procedures and benefits available to them as part of the organization.

4.2. TRAINING ON POCSO AND GTBT:

On 18th September 2024, Oasis Academy hosted a Prevention Training Programme focused on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POSCO) Act, 2012, at the Teacher's Room. Led by Christy J, an advocate with expertise in child protection, the session began at 12:30 PM and was attended by 23 participants, including both teaching and non-teaching staff from Oasis Academy and Oasis India. Ms. Sulekha Thapa, Deputy Director of Oasis India, introduced the resource person and set the tone for an engaging discussion. Christy J delivered a comprehensive presentation covering critical topics such as safe touch, unsafe touch, and the roles of educators in preventing child sexual abuse.





The training emphasized the importance of building trust and open communication with students while educating them about personal boundaries and consent. Participants were actively engaged throughout the session, contributing to discussions and sharing insights. Christy J also presented a short film titled "Komal," which highlighted the

realities of child sexual abuse, and provided essential resources such as helpline numbers. The feedback indicated that the training was not only informative but also instrumental in equipping staff with the knowledge to recognize and address potential abuse cases effectively. Overall, the session was deemed a success in enhancing awareness and understanding of child protection issues within the school community.

4.3. WORKSHOP ON INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES:

On 16th September 2024, Oasis Academy conducted a workshop titled "Understanding Intellectual Disabilities, Child Developmental Stages, and Addressing Substance Abuse in Schools" at the Teachers' Common Room. The session, led by Mr. Letkhoson, an Academic Dean and Assistant Professor at Kanggui Christian College, took place from 1:30 PM to 2:30 PM and was attended by both teaching and non-teaching staff.

The workshop provided valuable insights into the complexities of intellectual disabilities and the various developmental stages children go through. Mr. Letkhoson emphasized the importance of recognizing these stages to effectively support students in their learning environments. Additionally, the discussion on addressing substance abuse in schools was particularly relevant, offering strategies for early intervention and support. Overall, the workshop enriched the staff's understanding and approach to supporting all students, fostering a more inclusive and responsive educational atmosphere.



4.4. OASIS INDIA POLICY TRAINING: ALL STAFF

On 23rd and 24th September 2024, Oasis Academy conducted a training session for all teaching and non-teaching staff, led by Mr. Mangneo Lhungdim, Executive Director of Oasis India. Held in the Teacher's Common Room from 1:00 PM to 2:30 PM, the training focused on the **Disciplinary Code of Conduct and the 9 Habits**, as well as the **Staff Emergency Fund**.

Mr. Mangneo underscored the importance of the Disciplinary Code in promoting professional conduct within the school environment. He also elaborated on the 9 Habits as foundational values that contribute to a positive work-place culture. Furthermore, details about the Staff Emergency Fund were provided, emphasizing its purpose in

assisting staff during unforeseen circumstances. At the conclusion of the training, all staff members signed the Conflict of Interest undertaking, reinforcing their commitment to the ethical standards and policies of the organization.
