2. ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

2.1. Revision of Evaluation Card :

On 5th May 2025, the student evaluation card was revised to better reflect a comprehensive assessment approach aligned with the principles of holistic education. The new version includes the addition of PSEL (Physical, Social, Emotional Learning) as a distinct area of evaluation. This inclusion aims to recognize and support the development of students' emotional intelligence, social skills, and physical well-being. Furthermore, dictation exercises have been introduced under co-scholastic subjects, particularly within language learning domains, to enhance students' listening, spelling, and writing skills. These updates are in line with the school's vision to provide a balanced evaluation system that nurtures both scholastic and non-scholastic aspects of student growth.

2.2. Periodic Test 1 Routine :

The Periodic Test 1 (PT-1) routine was shared with all parents on 28th May 2025. The routine included detailed information on the dates and subjects scheduled for the assessments. 4.3. Bagless Day Activities:

As part of its commitment to holistic education, Oasis Academy observed its first Bagless Day on the 30th and 31st of May 2025. The objective of this initiative was to promote life skills education—empowering students with practical abilities that encourage independence, responsibility, and confidence in day-to-day life.

The activities were carefully designed and tailored to suit different age groups. In the Nursery, children practiced folding napkins and buttoning shirts, enhancing their fine motor skills and self-care abilities. Students of LKG and UKG learned tying laces, continued with buttoning shirts, and engaged in sorting colours, which helped with both coordination and cognitive development.

In Classes I and II, students took part in basic household responsibilities such as sweeping with small brooms and folding clothes, fostering a sense of responsibility and contribution.

Students from Classes III to VIII were introduced to first aid, where they learned about the importance of timely medical response and were taught basic bandaging techniques through demonstrations and guided explanations.
