2. ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

2.1. Preparedness for Half Yearly Examinations:

The examinations are scheduled from 8th to 20th September 2025. The preparedness for the exams is as follows:

2.2.0. Examination Orientation:

An examination orientation was held on 3rd September 2025 with teachers and on 4th September 2025 with students, where all necessary information was shared. This included the examination schedule, timings to be followed, and general examination protocols.

2.2.1. Examination Routine:

The examination routine for all classes, from Nursery to Class VIII, was prepared following the standard pattern and distributed to students on 18th August 2025.

2.2.2. Examination Sitting Plan:

The sitting plan was arranged to ensure a smooth flow during the exams, ensuring that no two students from the same class are seated together. This arrangement helps maintain discipline and ensures that the examinations are conducted smoothly.

2.2.3. Examination Register:

A register containing details of the subjects, examination schedules, and student absentees was maintained to ensure accurate record-keeping and facilitate effective monitoring during the examinations.

2.2.4. Examination Admit Card:

Admit cards were distributed to students on 26th August 2025. These documents contain all essential student details and serve as a mandatory requirement for entry into the examination hall. All students must bring their admit cards to enable smooth verification and compliance with exam protocols.

2.2.5. Examination Attendance Chart:

A dedicated attendance chart was created to record student presence during examinations. Unlike the regular attendance register, this chart focuses solely on examination attendance, ensuring an accurate record of participation for each assessment.

2.2.6. Examination Duty Chart:

A duty chart was maintained to assign teachers to different exam halls on a rotation basis. This systematic approach helps distribute responsibilities evenly among staff members and ensures adequate supervision during examinations.

3. VALUE-BASED & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

3.1. Habit Champion of the Month – August 2025

At Oasis Academy, the Habit Champion of the Month initiative acknowledges and celebrates students who best exemplify the monthly habit theme through their actions and behavior.

On 5th August 2025, students who embodied the habit for the months of June and July – “Humble” – were honored during a special assembly. Certificates and badges were awarded to the selected students in recognition of their modesty, respectfulness, and willingness to value others.

We were privileged to have Mrs. Arati Rabha, mother of Dibakar Rabha (Class IV), as the Resource Person for the day. She exhorted the students to study hard, stay disciplined, and always strive to be good learners and better human beings.

To carry the spirit forward, the habit theme for the month of August – “Honest” – was introduced during the same assembly, inspiring students to practice truthfulness, integrity, and sincerity in their daily lives. The Habit Champion of the Month – August award will be presented in the first week of September 2025.

3.2. Weekly Activity Highlights – August 2025

Throughout August 2025, students were actively engaged in weekly activities during their indoor activity periods. These sessions were designed to help students understand the significance of important days — not merely by hearing about them, but by participating in meaningful activities.

The following occasions were observed:

1. Friendship Day – 1st week
2. Indian Independence Day – 2nd week
3. World Humanitarian Day – 3rd week
4. National Sports Day – 4th week

The activities included card making, debates, poetry writing, creating a “Tree of Hope,” painting, coloring, and other interactive tasks that fostered creativity, awareness, and student involvement.



3.3. Club Activities – 9th August 2025:

Club activities were conducted on 9th August 2025 and were divided into three engaging sessions.

In the first session, students participated in their respective clubs:

- The Arts & Creative Expression Club presented a patriotic dance performance, celebrating the spirit of the nation.
- The Environmental & Social Responsibility Club carried out compound cleaning and developed a mini garden by planting trees and flowers, fostering environmental awareness and responsibility.
- The Science & Innovation Club conducted exciting experiments, including Invisible Ink with Lemon Juice (Oxidation) and Balloon Racket (Newton’s Third Law of Motion), sparking scientific curiosity and hands-on learning.
- The Skill-based Vocational Club engaged students in paper bag making, promoting creativity, skill development, and eco-friendly practices.

The second session was a hybrid session led by the Skill-based Vocational Club, where all students participated in a collaborative activity, enhancing interaction and learning beyond club boundaries.

In the third session, the Games and Sports Club organized various indoor games, ensuring active participation, teamwork, and enjoyment despite weather limitations.



3.4. Learning Beyond the Blackboard – August 2025

As part of the ongoing “Learning Beyond the Blackboard” initiative, each school club takes turns to creatively update the soft board at the school entrance, highlighting their activities and contributions.



For the month of August 2025, the responsibility was taken up by the Skill-Based Vocational Club. The board was thoughtfully decorated with students’ handmade works, showcasing their creativity and practical skills. This effort not only brightened the school entrance but also reflected the spirit of hands-on learning promoted by the club.

3.5. Bagless Activity – 29th & 30th August 2025

The two-day Bagless Activity for the month of August was held on 29th and 30th August 2025 under the theme “Creative Strokes.”

We were privileged to have Mrs. Dipandita Rabha, Drawing Teacher at Chitrakala Art Academy, Prathamik Vidyalaya, Jayantipur — and mother of our Nursery student, Master Angshuman G. Sangma — as the Resource Person for the sessions.

Students thoroughly enjoyed the activities. A felicitation program was held during the morning assembly on 30th August, where Mrs. Rabha, in her address, highlighted that *art is creativity* and benefits both those naturally inclined toward it and those who are not. She emphasized that art helps students improve focus, handwriting,



creativity, and inner peace. She also explained that, in painting, two key elements must always be observed carefully: the source of light and the shadow it casts on the object.

On the first day, the activity was conducted with the Foundation Section, while on the second day, it was carried out with the Preparatory and Middle Sections. After the “Colour Strokes” creative sessions, students also participated in several outdoor sports events organized by the Sports Club, making the Bagless Day both enjoyable and enriching.

Simultaneously, on 30th August, a social work program was organized under the leadership of the School Eco Club. Staff members, both teaching and non-teaching, who were not directly involved in Bagless sessions, actively took part in cleaning the school campus, planting flowers, trimming trees, and mowing the grass — all contributing towards the beautification of our campus.



4. Cultural & Celebratory Events

4.1 Indian Independence day Celebration:

Oasis Academy proudly celebrated Independence Day 2025 with great enthusiasm and patriotic fervor. The celebration was observed in two sessions, with activities spread throughout the week leading up to the main event.

During the activity periods, students actively participated in a variety of engaging programs, including poetry recitation, poster-making, drawing and coloring the national flag, slogan writing, and tri-color art and craft. These activities allowed students to creatively express their love for the nation and deepen their understanding of India’s independence.

On 15th August, the main celebration commenced with the flag hoisting ceremony conducted by Mrs. Nilima Das, the newly elected Ward Member of Ward No. 7 (covering Mairapur, Mekurikuchi, Gorakhohonia, and Puran Sukurberia), accompanied by Mr. Armstrong, Legal Advisor of Oasis Academy.

The program was further enriched with colorful cultural performances by the Dance Club and students from different sections, paying heartfelt tribute to India’s freedom fighters. The presence of a good number of parents added warmth and encouragement, making the day even more memorable.



4.2. Observation of World Humanitarian Day :

Oasis Academy observed World Humanitarian Day during the morning assembly on 19th August 2025, led by the students of Class VII. The program was attended by all staff and students.

The Preparatory Section and Class VIII students presented a short drama highlighting the importance of humanitarian values. This was followed by an address by Sir Lemlalthang, who reminded everyone that while the world is full of human beings, true humanity is often missing, and urged all to strive to be genuinely humane.

Further, Md. Lamtinneng, Principal, Oasis Academy, emphasized the month's theme of *Honesty* as a vital step toward kindness and humanity. He encouraged students to practice honesty in words and actions and to do good without expecting rewards, thereby contributing to a better world.

The program concluded with the recitation of the National Pledge and singing of the National Anthem, led by Class VII students, after which students dispersed to their respective classes.



4.3. Observation of National Sports Day :

Oasis Academy observed National Sports Day on 29th August 2025 with a special assembly conducted by the Sports Club, highlighting the importance of sports and fitness in daily life.

Throughout the week, students enthusiastically participated in a range of indoor activities, while the main day featured an outdoor sports event that added excitement and energy to the celebration.

The highlight of the day was a lively tug-of-war competition between the teaching and non-teaching staff, which created much cheer and enthusiasm among the audience. The teaching staff emerged as the winners of the friendly match.



5. STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

5.1. Training Session: Lesson Plan :

A training session on “Lesson Plan” was conducted by the Principal, Ma’am Elizabeth, on 4th August 2025. The session emphasized the importance of lesson planning in guiding effective teaching, ensuring objectives are met, and keeping learning structured.


Teachers were introduced to the SMART approach (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-bound) for setting objectives and the 5Es Model (Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate, Evaluate) for planning lessons. Key aspects such as designing engaging activities, managing time, including assessments, and using resources effectively were also discussed.

The one-hour session was highly practical and informative, equipping teachers with strategies to enhance lesson delivery and improve student engagement.

5.2. Training Session: Goal Setting :

Two training sessions on Goal Setting were conducted for the teachers of Oasis Academy.

The first session was held on 12th August 2025, led by Mr. Philip Devaraj, HR Manager – Learning and Development, Oasis India, through an online platform. As Oasis India introduced a new format of goal setting for mid-term and end-term, the session familiarized teachers with the updated process.



A follow-up training was organized on 18th August 2025, facilitated by the Principal, Oasis Academy, in offline mode. This session provided detailed instructions on filling out the new format and explained the content thoroughly to ensure clarity.


Both sessions proved to be informative and essential in equipping teachers with the necessary understanding of the revised goal-setting framework.
