2. ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

2.1. Half Yearly Examinations:

The examinations are scheduled from 8th to 20th September 2025.

2.1.0. Examination Orientation:

An examination orientation was held on 3rd September 2025 with teachers and on 4th September 2025 with students, where all necessary information was shared. This included the examination schedule, timings to be followed, and general examination protocols.

2.1.1. Examination Sitting arrangements:

On 4th September 2025, examination sitting arrangements were made at the academy. The designated teachers took responsibility for preparing the classrooms and ensuring proper order. Roll numbers were systematically pasted on the desks in advance to guide students to their allotted seats.

The arrangement was designed in such a way that students were seated in a mixed manner, ensuring fairness and minimizing the chances of malpractice during the examination. This proactive measure helped create a disciplined environment conducive to smooth conduct of the exam.

2.1.2. Commencement of Half Yearly Examination:

The Half-Yearly Examinations for all classes commenced on Monday, 8th September 2025. The exams were conducted in a smooth and orderly manner under the supervision of the designated staff.

The Kindergarten students successfully completed their examinations on 16th September 2025, while classes I and above concluded their exams on 20th September 2025.

Overall, the examination process was carried out efficiently without any major difficulties, ensuring a fair and disciplined environment for all students.

2.2. REVISION OF TEACHERS' ROUTINE:

Following the completion of the Half-Yearly Examinations, the teachers' routine was reviewed and revised to meet the academic needs of the students. Adjustments were made to ensure balanced subject coverage, effective time management, and smooth continuation of the syllabus for the upcoming term.

The revised routine has been shared with all teachers for implementation from October 8th 2025 onwards.



2.3. Preparedness for Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) :

The Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) was held on 27th September 2024 with necessary arrangements made to ensure a smooth and meaningful interaction between parents and teachers.

2.3.1. Parents' Feedback Form (Google Form):

A structured feedback form was designed to collect parents' opinions on key areas such as school administration, safety measures, quality of teaching and learning, and the scope and effectiveness of co-curricular activities. The responses provided valuable insights into parents' satisfaction levels and helped the school identify areas for further improvement.

2.3.2. Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM):

The PTM commenced at 9:00 am and was conducted through one-on-one interactions between parents and class teachers. During the session, parents were given their children's half-yearly examination results along with an overview of their academic performance. Teachers also shared observations on students' strengths, areas requiring improvement, and possible strategies for additional support. This interaction created a collaborative platform for parents and teachers to work together towards the holistic development of students.



3. VALUE-BASED & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

3.1. Observation of Social Justice Day :

Oasis Academy observed *Social Justice Day* on 25th September 2025 under the theme "*Justice through Voice: Honoring Zubeen Garg's Legacy*". The assembly was graced by Mr. Advocate Armstrong Sangma, Legal Advisor of Oasis Academy, who inspired the students by highlighting the significance of the day. He also connected the importance of social justice with the life and contributions of our beloved *Zubeen Da*, who stood as a voice of the people and an icon of justice for the state of Assam. The program served as a reminder to students of their role in upholding fairness, equality, and justice in society.



3.2. Habit Champion of the Month

At Oasis Academy, the Habit Champion of the Month initiative continues to acknowledge and celebrate students who best exemplify the monthly habit theme through their actions and behavior.

On 1st September 2025, the Habit Champion of the Month award for August, under the theme “Honest”, was presented during a special assembly. The awardee received a Habit Champion Certificate, along with a badge and chocolate, in recognition of leading an exemplary life of honesty and integrity.





5. STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

5.1. GARIMA Online Course: Supporting Mental Health of DV Survivors :

The GARIMA Online Course on “Supporting the Mental Health Needs of Domestic Violence Survivors” is an 8-week program held every Wednesday from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM (IST). The course began on 10th September 2025 and is designed to strengthen participants’ understanding and response to the mental health needs of DV survivors.
