## 2.2. Weekly Indoor Activity Highlights – January 2026

Throughout January 2026, students actively participated in structured weekly indoor activities conducted during the designated activity periods. These activities were thoughtfully planned to create awareness, instil values, and help students understand important national and social themes through interactive, reflective, and creative learning experiences.

The activities and observances during the month were as follows:

- 1. National Human Trafficking Awareness Day – First Week (6th–9th January 2026):** Classroom-based awareness activities were conducted to sensitize students about human trafficking, personal safety, and the importance of protecting human rights. Through age-appropriate discussions, storytelling, posters, and teacher-led interactions, students were guided to understand safe and unsafe situations, the value of human dignity, and the role of society in preventing exploitation.
- 2. Second Week:** No indoor activities were conducted during this week due to regular academic engagements and assessments.
- 3. Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti – Third Week (19th–22nd January 2026):** To commemorate the birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, students took part in activities highlighting patriotism, leadership, courage, and sacrifice. Activities included short talks, storytelling sessions, inspirational quotes, and discussions on Netaji's contribution to India's freedom struggle, encouraging students to imbibe values of discipline and national pride.
- 4. Republic Day Observance – Fourth Week (27th–30th January 2026):** Indoor activities related to Republic Day were conducted to help students understand the significance of the Indian Constitution and democratic values. Through drawing, colouring, discussions, and interactive sessions, students learned about national symbols, unity in diversity, and the responsibilities of being responsible citizens of India.



## 2.3 Annual Student Outing Programme

Oasis Academy, Guwahati successfully observed Bagless Day on 22nd January 2026 with the aim of promoting experiential, activity-based, and skill-oriented learning among students. The initiative provided learners with an opportunity to explore creativity and practical life skills beyond textbooks.

The programme began with a morning prayer led by the students of Class IV, which set a calm, disciplined, and positive tone for the day's events.

For smooth conduct and effective participation, students were divided into three groups:

- Group A: Nursery to Class II
- Group B: Class III to Class IV
- Group C: Class VI to Class VIII

The activities were conducted in two sessions. The first session (10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.) was organised for students from Nursery to Class II, while the second session (12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.) included students from Class III to Class VIII.

During the sessions, students enthusiastically engaged in a variety of hands-on activities such as stitching, hanky craft, embroidery, buttoning shirts, and bead craft. These activities helped develop fine motor skills, creativity, independence, and confidence among students. The joyful participation and keen interest shown by the learners reflected the success and effectiveness of the programme.

At the conclusion of the activities, all students and teachers assembled at the football court for a short presentation programme. The programme was led by Ms. Rebecca, followed by a felicitation ceremony conducted by the respected Principal, Mrs. Elizabeth Lamtinneng. The event concluded with a prayer.



## 3. Cultural and Celebratory Events

### 3.1 Observance of National Human Trafficking Awareness Day – 2026

National Human Trafficking Awareness Day was observed on 12th January 2026 at Oasis Academy and the Oasis Tailoring and Skilling Centre, Mairapur, Assam, with the objective of creating awareness among students, parents, and community members about the growing menace of human trafficking and the urgent need for prevention, vigilance, and collective responsibility.

At Oasis Academy, the observance was conducted during the school assembly and was led by the Preparatory Section. The significance of the day was explained by Ms. Sujata Kiro, who sensitively addressed the students on the meaning, causes, and consequences of human trafficking. This was followed by a demonstration presented by the students of Class VIII, under the guidance of Mr. Letkhongam Haokip, which illustrated how trafficking occurs and highlighted the importance of being alert, informed, and cautious. The demonstration enabled students to better understand the realities of trafficking and the importance of personal safety.

A separate awareness programme was organised at the Oasis Tailoring and Skilling Centre, attended by parents, students of Classes VI to VIII, and community members, with approximately 40 participants. Adv. Babita Saikia, Advocate, Guwahati High Court, Human Rights Activist, and State Coordinator (Child Protection), Bachpan Bachao Andolan, was invited as the Resource Person. In her session, she described human trafficking as a serious violation of human rights and a grave criminal offence. She also shared practical and preventive measures to help individuals and communities protect themselves and others from becoming victims of trafficking.

The programme was hosted by Ms. Ione Tungnung, Social Work Manager, Interception Project, Assam. The Keynote Address was delivered by Mrs. Lamtinneng Elizabeth, Principal of Oasis Academy, who emphasised the importance of awareness, education, and collective community action in preventing human trafficking, particularly among children and vulnerable groups.

The programme concluded with a Vote of Thanks proposed by Mr. Thangminlun Vaiphei, Project Manager, GSL-P, Oasis India, who expressed sincere gratitude to the resource person, participants, and the organising team for their active cooperation and support.



### 3.2 Observance of Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti

Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti was observed on 22nd January 2026 during the school morning assembly at Oasis Academy. The assembly was conducted by the students of Class VI.
