2. ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

2.1 Periodic Test 2 – Academic Session 2025–26

As part of the academic evaluation process, Oasis Academy successfully conducted the Periodic Test 2 for the session 2025–26. The assessment aimed to evaluate students' academic progress and reinforce the importance of consistent learning throughout the year.

1. Admit Card Distribution: Admit cards were issued to all students on 17th November 2025, ensuring preparedness and transparency in the examination process.
2. Exam Routine Distribution: The exam routine was distributed on 10th November 2025.
3. Exam Orientation:
 - An orientation session was held with teachers on 19th November 2025.
 - Class Teachers conducted the student orientation on 21st November 2025 to familiarize them with exam guidelines and expectations.
4. Commencement of Examination: The Periodic Test 2 was conducted from 25th November to 4th December 2025. Students appeared for the examination with sincerity, discipline, and a commitment to academic excellence.

2.2. Science Olympiad Test for Class VIII :

The Science Olympiad Test for Class VIII was successfully conducted on 20th November 2025 (Thursday) at Oasis Academy. The event was organised by Potential and Concept Academy, Dharapur, with the aim of developing scientific aptitude, analytical reasoning, and competitive spirit among students.

All Class VIII students took part in the Olympiad with great enthusiasm and diligence. The event provided them with a valuable platform to test their understanding of scientific concepts and to engage in an academically enriching experience.

The certificates and results are yet to be announced. As informed by the organizers, the results are expected to be declared by the second week of December 2025. Once the results are published, certificates will be distributed to all participants, while class toppers will receive gift hampers. Students securing top positions at the State level will become eligible for a scholarship of ₹12,000 per year until completion of Higher Secondary education.



3. VALUE-BASED & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

3.1. Habit Champion of the Month

At Oasis Academy, the Habit Champion of the Month initiative continues to recognize and celebrate students who exemplify the monthly character habit through their daily actions and behavior.

On 3rd November 2025, the Habit Champion of the Month award for October, under the theme “Compassionate”, was presented during a special assembly. 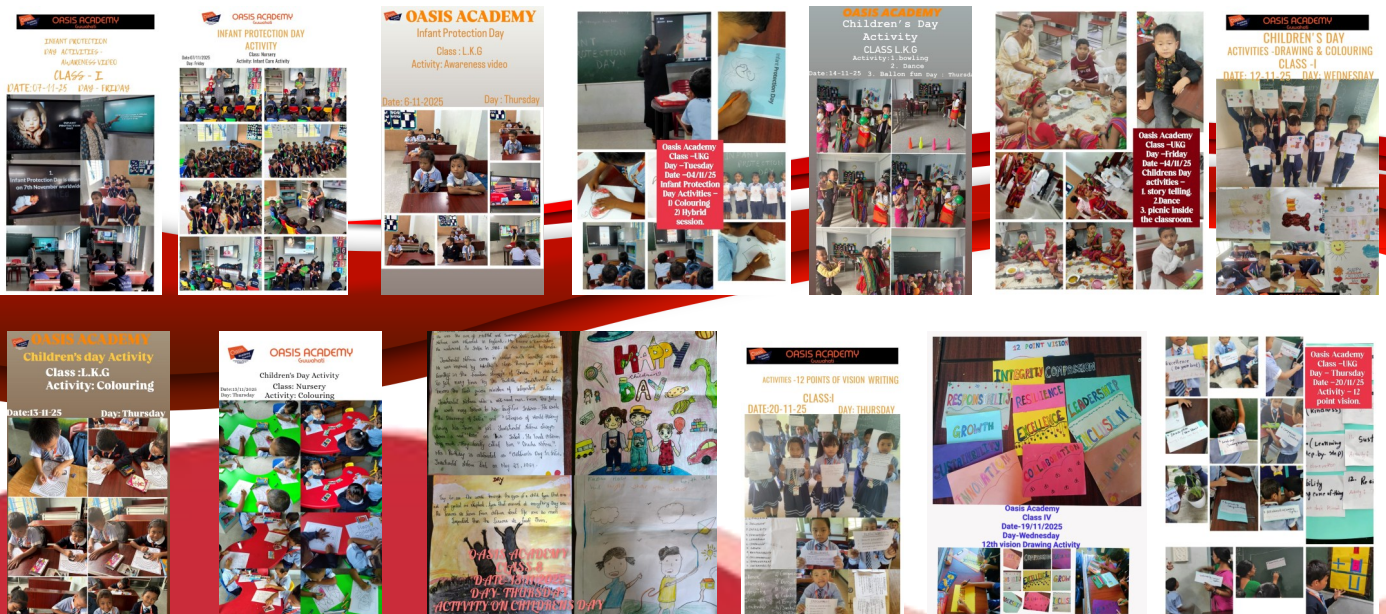
3. 12-Point Vision Activities – 3rd Week (16th–22nd November 2025)

8.2 Oasis Academy FFL Team Crowned Champions at Zubeen Garg Memorial Open Tournament

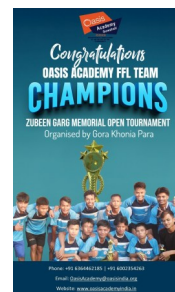
