2. ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

2.1. Pink Book Verification

The Pink Books of all classes were thoroughly checked on 4 May 2026 for the entire month. The review was conducted to ensure proper maintenance of records, completion of assigned work, and regular monitoring of students' academic progress.

2.2. Verification of School Event Registers

2.3. Academic Book Re-order

3.6.3 National Anti-Terrorism Day Activities (18th – 22nd May 2026)

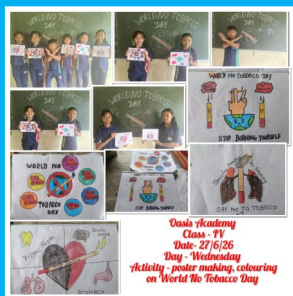
