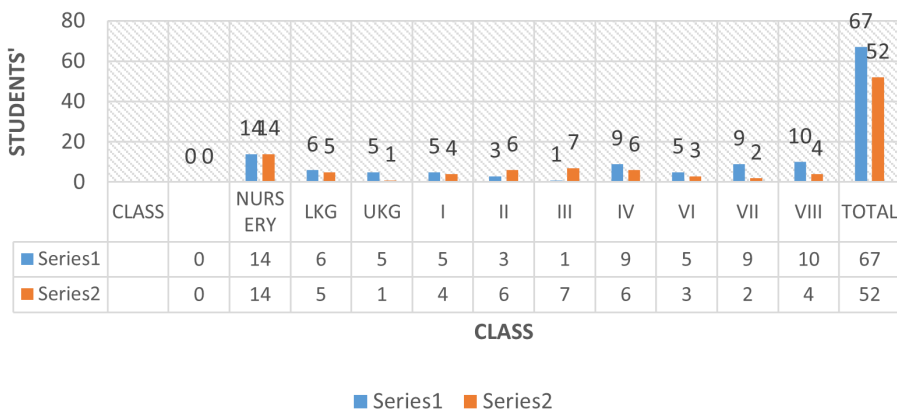

1. ACADEMIC INITIATIVES

1.1. PERIODIC TESTS & HALF-YEARLY EXAMINATION

Periodic Test I (PT I) was conducted from 9th to 18th June 2025 to assess students' initial learning progress and provide timely academic support. Periodic Test II (PT II) was held from 25th November to 5th December 2025 and was smoothly organized with proper planning and execution.

The Half-Yearly Examination took place from 8th to 20th September 2025, with all necessary preparations such as exam routines and guidelines shared in advance. These assessments helped in monitoring student performance and identifying areas requiring improvement. Parent-Teacher interactions were encouraged to discuss student progress and strengthen academic support.

1.2. FINAL EXAMINATION, RE-EXAMINATION & ANNUAL RESULTS

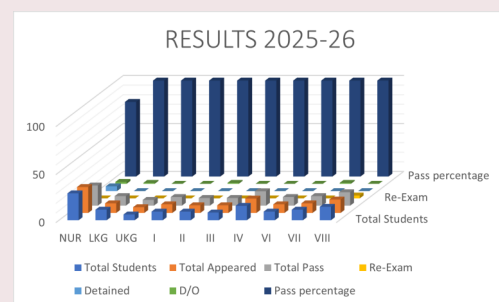
The Final Examination was conducted from 2nd to 13th March 2026 in an organized and systematic manner, ensuring maximum participation.

A re-examination was held on 16th March 2026 for students who did not pass initially. A total of 3 students appeared for the re-examination and successfully passed, contributing positively to the overall results.

For the academic year 2025–26, out of 116 students who appeared, 110 students successfully passed, resulting in an overall pass percentage of 94.83%. However, 5 students were detained and 5 students dropped out, which impacted the final outcome.

The Annual Result Declaration was conducted on 21st March 2026, followed by one-on-one Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) to discuss individual student performance and provide feedback for further improvement.

1.3. INTRODUCTION OF HEALTH, HYGIENE AND PSEL CLASSES

In April 2025, Oasis Academy introduced Health & Hygiene and Personal, Social & Emotional Learning (PSEL) classes as part of the regular timetable to promote the holistic development of students. The initiative, implemented under the guidance of the Principal, focuses on developing students' emotional intelligence, self-awareness, and healthy lifestyle habits.

1.4. REVISION OF STUDENT EVALUATION SYSTEM

On 5 May 2025, Oasis Academy revised the student evaluation card to adopt a more holistic assessment approach. The revised system incorporated PSEL as an evaluation component and introduced dictation exercises under co-scholastic subjects to strengthen language learning and overall student development.

1.5. ACADEMIC ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

Oasis Academy conducted its major academic assessments throughout the academic session to monitor students' learning progress. Periodic Test-1 was conducted from 9-18 June 2025, Half-Yearly Examinations from 8-20 September 2025, Periodic Test-2 from 25 November to 4 December 2025, and preparations for the Final Examinations were completed in February 2026. The final exam began on 2nd March 2026 and will end on 14th March 2026

1.6. PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS FOR ACADEMIC REVIEW

Parent-Teacher Meetings were conducted on 4 July and 20 December 2025 to strengthen collaboration between parents and teachers. During these meetings, parents received students' marksheets and discussed academic progress, strengths, and improvement areas with class teachers.



1.7. MENTEE-MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The Mentee-Mentorship Program was introduced on 11 October 2025 to provide structured academic guidance and emotional support to students. Follow-up mentoring sessions were conducted on 20 December 2025, strengthening teacher-student relationships and supporting students in setting academic goals.



1.8. ACADEMIC REVIEW AND PLANNING

A section-wise academic review meeting was held on 28 January 2026 involving the school leadership and teaching staff. The meeting assessed student performance and discussed strategies to strengthen teaching-learning outcomes for the remaining academic term.



1.9. SCIENCE OLYMPIAD PARTICIPATION

Class VIII students participated in the Science Olympiad conducted by Potential and Concept Academy, Dharapur on 20 November 2025. The examination provided students with exposure to competitive academic platforms and helped enhance their scientific reasoning and analytical skills.



2. CAMPUS & LEARNING ENHANCEMENTS

2.1. CAMPUS CLEANLINESS AND ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES

Oasis Academy organized campus cleanliness and eco-work initiatives to maintain a healthy and welcoming learning environment. On 5 April 2025, teaching and non-teaching staff participated in a Mass Social Work Programme to clean the campus and plant saplings in preparation for the new academic session. A similar campus beautification initiative was conducted on 30 August



2025 under the Eco Club, promoting environmental responsibility among the school community.

2.2. STUDENT AWARENESS AND CAMPUS HYGIENE MEASURES

In May 2025, hygiene awareness signage displaying dos and don'ts was installed in school washrooms to encourage responsible behaviour and maintain cleanliness. In addition, the school administration issued a campus hygiene notice regarding animal management to ensure a safe and healthy environment for students.



3. VALUE-BASED & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING



3.1. ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS AND SUSTAINABILITY EDUCATION

Oasis Academy actively promoted environmental responsibility through awareness programmes and practical activities. World Earth Day was celebrated on 22 April 2025 with drawing, slogan writing, tree plantation, and campus clean-up activities involving students of Classes I–VIII. World Environment Day was also observed on 5 June 2025 in collaboration with A. Chik Association, Mairapur, where students and staff planted Ashoka and Devada saplings and participated in plastic waste collection drives.



3.2. HABIT CHAMPION CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Throughout the academic session, Oasis Academy conducted the Habit Champion of the Month recognition programme during school assemblies to promote character development. Students demonstrating values such as compassion, humility, honesty, forgiveness, hopefulness, joyfulness, and patience were recognized from April 2025 to February 2026. Guest parents and community members served as resource persons, encouraging students to practice positive values in their daily lives.



3.3. EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING THROUGH BAGLESS DAY PROGRAMMES



Oasis Academy organized Bagless Day experiential learning activities on 30–31 May 2025, 29–30 August 2025, and 22 January 2026 in alignment with NEP 2020. Students from Nursery to Class VIII participated in practical life-skill activities such as folding clothes, tying shoelaces, first aid, stitching, embroidery, bead craft, and creative art sessions guided by teachers and invited resource persons. These activities encouraged independence, creativity, and hands-on learning.



3.4. STUDENT EDUCATIONAL EXPOSURE AND EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

The Annual Student Adventurous Day Out was organized on 13 December 2025, where students visited selected locations for experiential learning outside the classroom. Teachers and several parents accompanied the students to ensure safety and supervision while encouraging curiosity, teamwork, and social interaction.



3.5. SAFETY, HEALTH, AND SOCIAL AWARENESS PROGRAMMES

To promote student safety and social awareness, several educational programmes were conducted during the year. A Fire and Safety Awareness Programme and Mock Drill was organized on 17 May 2025 in collaboration with the State Fire & Emergency Services, Assam, led by Station Officer Mr. Awal Abdul and his team. Additional awareness initiatives included Anti-Drug Awareness activities in June 2025 and a Personal Safety Awareness Programme (Good Touch–Bad Touch) conducted from 1–6 December 2025 using smartboard presentations.



3.6. NATIONAL, SOCIAL, AND HISTORICAL AWARENESS ACTIVITIES

Students participated in various value-based activities to understand important historical, social, and national events. These included the commemoration of Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi (30 June–3 July 2025), Social Justice Day (25 September 2025) addressed by Mr. Armstrong Sangma, and awareness activities related to national observances such as Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti and Republic Day in January 2026. These activities helped students develop civic awareness and respect for national values.



3.7. CLUB ACTIVITIES FOR SKILL AND EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Oasis Academy conducted structured club activities involving Science & Innovation, Arts & Creative Expression, Skill-Based Vocational, Environmental, and Games & Sports Clubs. Sessions were held on 11 October 2025, 8 November 2025, and 7 February 2026, where students engaged in activities such as science experiments, art performances, environmental gardening, craft making, and sports events. These activities promoted creativity, teamwork, leadership, and practical learning beyond the classroom.



4. CULTURAL & CELEBRATORY EVENTS

4.1 STUDENT LEADERSHIP INVESTITURE CEREMONIES

The Student Council Investiture Ceremony for the academic year 2025–26 was held on 28 April 2025 at Oasis Academy Hall, where Sir Gour Ch. Barman, CRCC of 1 No. Rani Cluster, attended as the Chief Guest and encouraged student leaders to uphold responsibility



and service. The Foundation Section Investiture Ceremony was also conducted on 30 April 2025 during the morning assembly, where Mr. Babul Rabha conferred the sashes and motivated young learners to develop leadership qualities.

4.2 MOTHER'S DAY WEEK CELEBRATION

From 5 to 9 May 2025, Oasis Academy celebrated Mother's Day Week through classroom-based creative activities including letter writing, card making, bracelet making, and gratitude sharing. The activities were facilitated by class teachers to help students express appreciation and respect for their mothers.



4.3 INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY & WORLD MUSIC DAY CELEBRATION

On 21 June 2025, Oasis Academy celebrated International Yoga Day and World Music Day through a themed programme titled "YogAakar – A Fancy Dress Competition." Students from various sections dressed as nature elements, freedom fighters, and healthy habit heroes while demonstrating yoga poses, promoting health awareness and creativity.



4.4 INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION

The 79th Independence Day of India was celebrated on 15 August 2025 at Oasis Academy with patriotic fervor. The flag hoisting ceremony was conducted by Mrs. Nilima Das, Ward Member of Ward No. 7, followed by cultural performances, poetry recitations, and poster-making activities highlighting national pride and unity.



4.5 TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATION

Teachers' Day was celebrated on 5 September 2025 at Oasis Academy with a special programme organized by students and staff. The celebration was attended by Sir Mangneo, Executive Director of Oasis India, Sir Tongkhomang, Head of Northeast, and Mr. Armstrong Sangma, Legal Advisor of Oasis Academy. Students presented cultural performances and appreciation gifts to teachers.



4.6 AWARENESS OBSERVANCES ON SOCIAL AND HEALTH ISSUES

4.8. NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY OBSERVATION

National Science Day was observed on 27 February 2026 during the school assembly at Oasis Academy. Students presented cultural and educational performances highlighting the importance of science, while teachers explained the theme “Women in Science: Catalysing Viksit Bharat,” encouraging scientific curiosity and learning.



4.9. KINDERGARTEN GRADUATION DAY CUM ANNUAL RESULT DECLARATION (21 MARCH 2026):

The Kindergarten Graduation Day cum Annual Result Declaration was held on 21st March 2026, marking a proud milestone for our young learners.

5. CO-CURRICULAR ENGAGEMENT

5.1 LEARNING BEYOND THE BLACKBOARD INITIATIVE

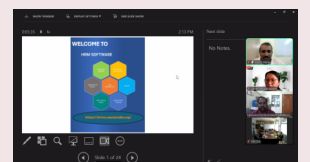
7.3 MEDIA TEAM COMMUNICATION TRAINING

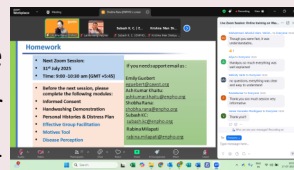
7.4 HRMS SOFTWARE TRAINING

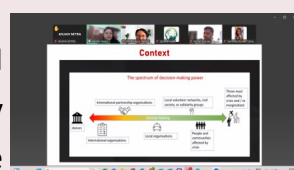
7.5 WASH'EM ONLINE TRAINING FOR SOUTH ASIA

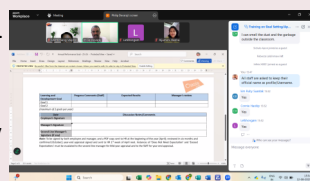


7.7 LESSON PLANNING TRAINING FOR TEACHERS

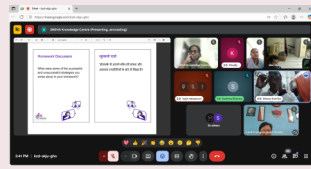
7.8 TEACHER GOAL-SETTING TRAINING

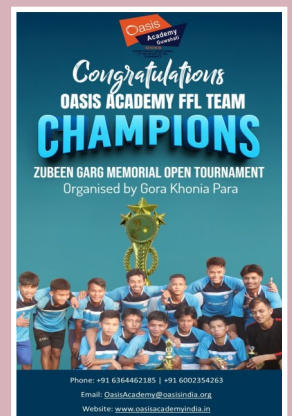


8.3 OASIS ACADEMY FOOTBALL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

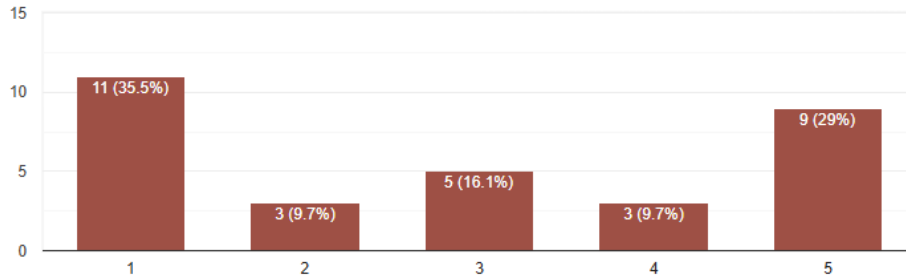

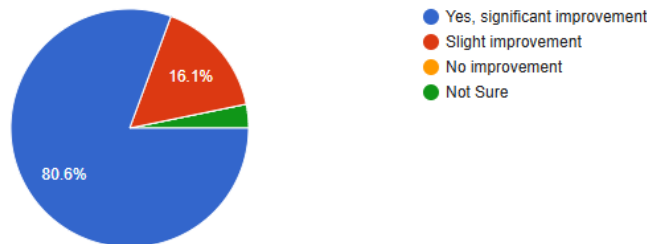

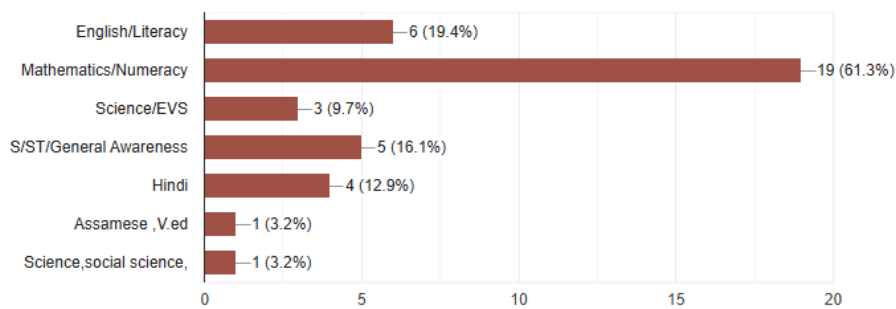

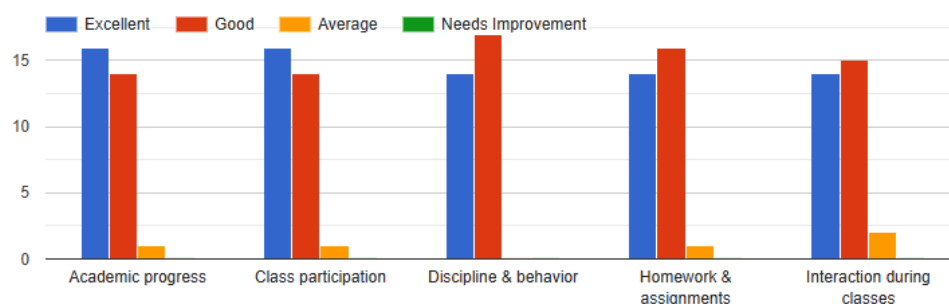

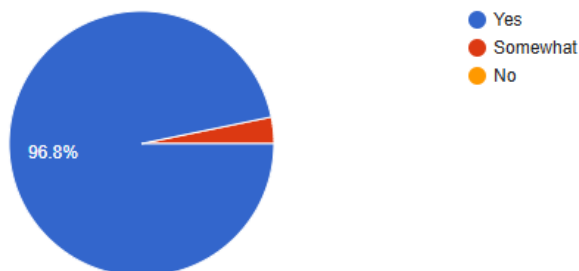

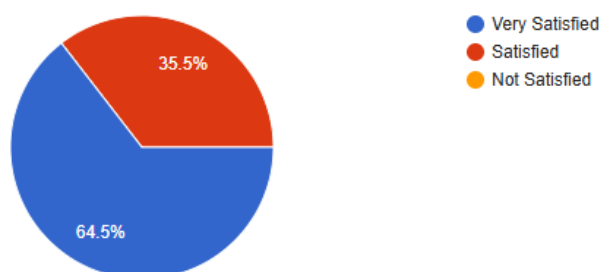

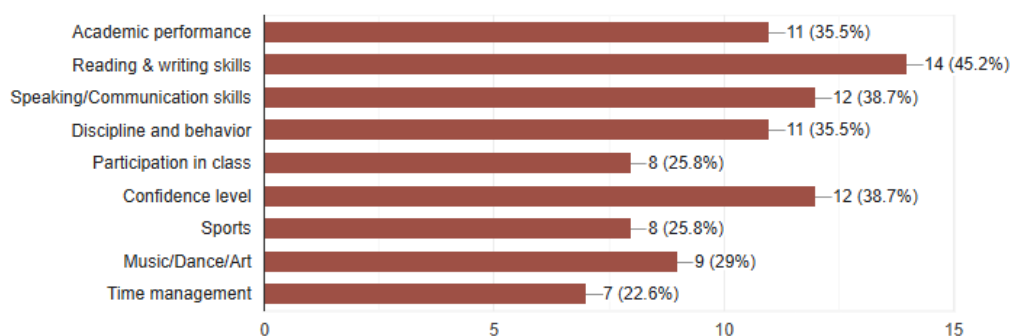

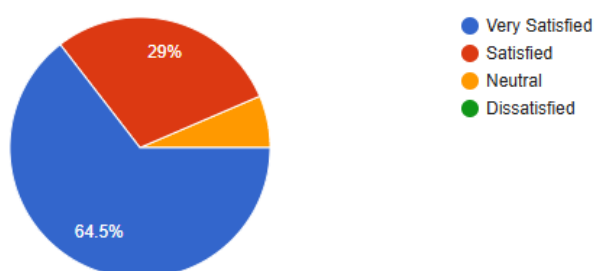

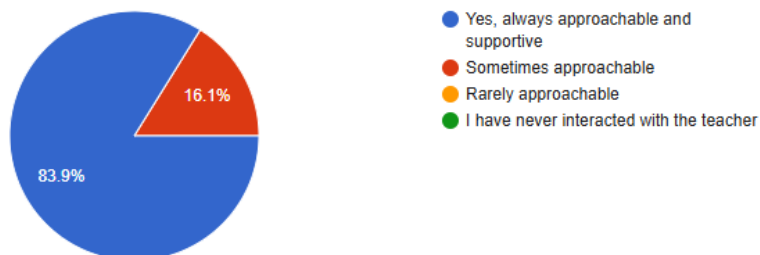

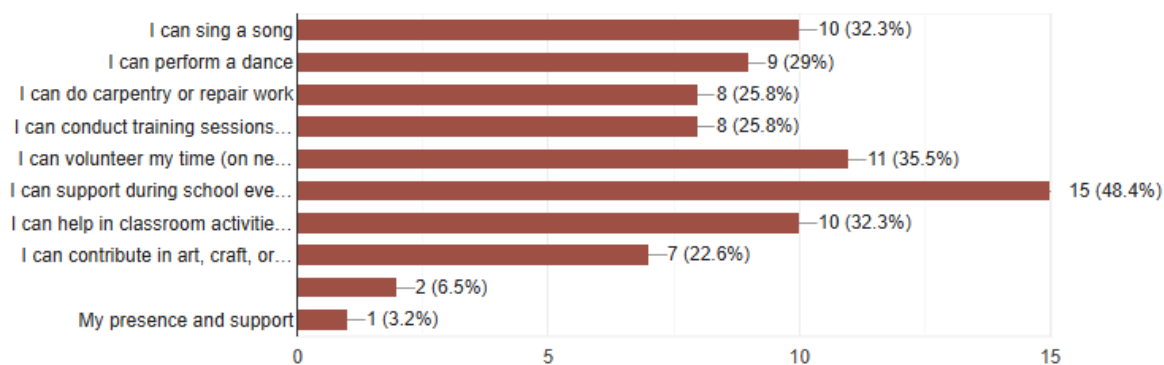
